

# RUGBY LEAGUE 1969-70

**JULY** The fixtures showed that more clubs were to play Sunday games to avoid live Rugby League on Saturday television. Only seven clubs did not have a Sunday game and many fixtures were down for Friday nights. The clubs still preferring Saturdays were Bradford Northern, Hull KR, Leeds, Wakefield Trinity, St Helens and Wigan.

The Rugby League decided that an international player would receive a blazer badge for a first appearance and a cap for a second. Only one cap would be awarded instead of as previously one cap for each series.

The Whitehaven shareholders passed a resolution that if they did not get any financial assistance they would have to amalgamate with Workington Town. The Rugby League responded by loaning £5,000 to Whitehaven Supporters' Club and hoped that the Whitehaven Rugby League Club would review its constitution in the near future.

**AUGUST** The Rugby League Council planned a shorter tour to Australia and New Zealand next year with only two games in New Zealand.

The Bramley players said they would not play on Sundays unless they received £5 extra each per game. For this season the Bramley terms had been revised to £16 win, £6 lose, instead of £14 win and £7 lose. Neither side would budge so the Bramley directors said they would rearrange fixtures to cut out Sundays.

The Rugby League agreed to loan Salford £30,000 towards the cost of a new stand, and Hull KR £20,000 towards the purchase of their ground.

**SEPTEMBER** The Rugby League agreed to a challenge match between the two county cup winners. The Yorkshire Cup was played earlier in the season but there was virtually no difference in attendances from last year.

Bramley offered their players an extra £2 to play against Halifax on a Sunday to avoid a clash with the Yorkshire Cup Final but they refused.

The Management Committee sent out a circular suggesting three divisions in the first part of the season and county competitions in the second. Thirteen clubs said yes, nine said no and eight didn't reply in time.

Barrow signed Keith Jarrett the Wales Rugby Union centre for £6,000 plus another £8,000 over the period of his contact.

**OCTOBER** Oldham were in financial difficulties because of low attendances. Chairman Ken Fisher said, 'We cannot go on for ever drawing in £300 a week and spending £600 a week'.

The itinerary for next years tour had not yet been agreed. Australia still wanted poorly supported up-county games and had not stated their attitude to television.

Keith Jarrett was selected for the Wales side after only one game for Barrow but he had to withdraw because of a hamstring injury. A former Wales Rugby Union colleague, Maurice Richards, signed for Salford one lunchtime and played for them the same evening.

For the Wales v France game Terry Price's car broke down and was half an hour late. Kel Coslett had to be brought off with a cut head so Wales played a man short until Price was ready.

A meeting of clubs agreed to suspend the two-thirds majority for bye law changes and to have another meeting to sort out a fixture formula on a simple majority.

The Rugby League decided that home clubs would receive £400 for a televised game and for cup-ties the away club would also receive the same sum.

Leeds were to play a Catalan XIII (basically Perpignan) for the Wills European Club Championship. It was said to be a novelty to mark the extension of colour television to the north.

There was no conclusive winner for the European International Championship so France suggested a second series of games to settle it.

St Helens and Wigan said they were against the four tackles rule. They called it 'panic football' because everybody was in such a desperate rush to get rid of the ball. Arthur Keegan (Hull) said a canvas of opinion among the players would result overwhelmingly in favour of the rule which had ended the old steam-roller methods.

**NOVEMBER** Bramley had another go at persuading the players to turn out on Sundays by offering for every gate in excess of £250 and extra £1 per player for every £100. The game against Bradford Northern was used as a trial and the receipts were £775, much higher than normal, but the players still refused to play in regular Sunday games.

Huddersfield were refused a £10,000 loan by the Rugby League so the club made a public appeal to reduce their £7,000 bank overdraft. Chairman Jack Armstrong said, 'Unless we get some money from somewhere it could mean packing in'.

Hoping for better times the Bradford Northern chairman said the club had spent £25,000 on drainage for the pitch in the last five years. 'We could have bought two Keith Jarrett's for that.'

A special meeting of clubs was arranged to consider eight schemes for a fixture formula. A series of votes reduced them down to three which were Barrow (one division), Castleford (two divisions) and the Management Committee (three divisions).

The voting was eleven, twelve and fifteen, but when Barrow were eliminated Castleford won the final round by seventeen votes to ten. It was for two divisions with four up and four down. The Rugby League chairman, Mr J Davies of Widnes, said the last two divisions scheme was ended by a simple majority. This time at least eighteen of the thirty clubs would have to agree to end it.

The clubs also voted 23-6 in favour of the four tackles rule, 18-12 against reducing a drop-goal and conversion to one point, and 16-14 against allowing a substituted player to go back on.

The referee ended the Workington Town v York game eight minutes early because too many players were being injured on the frozen pitch.

**DECEMBER** The Rugby League were in dispute with the Australian Rugby League over Australian games on Yorkshire Television on Sundays. The Rugby League wanted them stopped altogether but the Australians would only agree not to show them at the same time as games in England. The Rugby League thought it would interfere with their bargaining rights with the BBC in which exclusivity was a main point.

Rugby League secretary Bill Fallowfield said next year's tour must be regarded as doubtful.

It was revealed that the Castleford scheme was for fifteen teams in each division with a top four play off to decide the champions.

The Management Committee decided to suggest scrapping the play off so that the top club were champions, and to have a sixteen-fourteen split to prevent two clubs being without a game each week.

Both Castleford and Hunslet objected and said if the Council agreed it would not be the scheme decided by the clubs. The only way to change it was to have another special meeting.

**JANUARY** Harry Street resigned as Huddersfield coach to help the club out of its difficulties. He had eighteen months left out of a four year contract and it would save the club £1,000.

The Management Committee agreed to ask all clubs their views on the two divisions scheme and call another meeting if necessary. Six days later many clubs had not replied so Bill Fallowfield sent out a letter saying it was important to get the fixture problem settled quickly, and any club not replying within ten days would be subject to disciplinary action.

The Wakefield Trinity players joined those at Bramley in refusing to play any more Sunday games.

The Rugby League agreed to carry on with the arrangement for the 1970 tour even though the Australian Rugby League refused to give way over their games on British Television. The Great Britain players would share 35% of any tour profits instead of 30% as on the last tour.

Dicky Thomas (Oldham), the referee for the game in France, was knocked out by a spectator at the end of the game. He was rescued by the police and spent the night in a Perpignan hospital. The French Rugby League banned internationals at the ground until 1971.

The Australian Rugby League chairman Bill Buckley phoned Bill Fallowfield and they settled their differences over Australian games on British Television. Yorkshire Television said they had no immediate plans but would still like to televise Australian games.

**FEBRUARY** A special meeting of clubs was held to resolve the fixtures problem. The previously agreed formula was scrapped - only ten clubs voting in favour. They then voted 23-6 against the Management Committee's three division scheme, 16-14 against York's 15-15 scheme, and 17-13 against a Barrow one league scheme.

York then beat Barrow 16-13. On a final vote whether to adopt the York scheme or postpone the whole affair yet again York won 21-9. Their idea was one division in which the top fifteen played each other plus three clubs out of the bottom fifteen, and the bottom fifteen played each other plus three out of the top fifteen. Mr Harding said that since April 1968 there had been twenty-one meetings on fixture reform.

The Salford players refused to play at Batley after the referee declared the pitch fit. Coach Griff Jenkins said 'I can't pitchfork players out there if they are not willing to play'. The referee said the pitch was frozen in parts but the Batley players were willing to turn out. Batley had employed fifty men and spent £150 on preparing the pitch. All the other games on the same day were called off. Batley claimed £1,000 compensation and the two points but the Rugby League awarded all legitimate expenses against Salford who were also fined £100.

**MARCH** Rochdale Hornets refused to play at Swinton on the 7<sup>th</sup> as arranged by the Rugby League after the clubs could not agree on a date. Mr F. Kershaw, the Hornets secretary, said they had just played four games in nine days in atrocious conditions and the players needed a rest. Four days later the Council censured the Management Committee for only fining Salford £100. Later the same day the Management Committee let Rochdale off with a caution.

A French plan for the World Cup in which each country would play each other twice on five Saturdays with half the games in France was turned down by the Rugby League.

**APRIL** The Halifax directors warned the club could go out of existence if aid was not forthcoming. The situation had been made worse by the loss of £4,000 on a pop festival organised to raise money. The club asked for loans at 5% interest and offered life membership for £50. They were nearly £40,000 in debt and had to raise £10,000 to enable a start to be made next season.

The Hull KR loan was finalised at £24,500. The cost of buying their ground was about £60,000. (They had sold it in 1938 for just under £11,000.)

**MAY** Castleford were ordered to play the replay of the Championship play-off at St Helens five days before the Cup Final at Wembley. Castleford said because of injuries they would have to send a reserve side.

The Disciplinary Committee decided that in future a player receiving two cautions in a season, or calendar year, would be treated as a sending off.

Keith Hepworth (Castleford) became the first player to have his name taken at Wembley after a head tackle on Colin Tyrer. It brought further calls for the Rugby League to do something to stop such tackles. Alf Drewry (Yorkshire Post) wrote it had almost reached the point where such tackles were acceptable. Tyrer's jaw was broken in two places.

On the tour Wide Bay used six substitutes which Great Britain team manager Jack Harding described as farcical.

**JUNE** High tackling was blamed for the defeat in the first Test. Cynics said it might have improved the chances in the second Test by eliminating the opposition. Ron Lynch had a broken cheekbone, Graeme Langlands an injured jaw and suspected broken nose, Jim Morgan had a broken nose, and Artie Beetson a suspected broken nose.

Johnny Whiteley criticised the standard of Australian refereeing at a reception in Sydney. he said they were penalised 20-2 in Darwin. Team captain Frank Myler supported him saying Australia had not been pulled up for one forward pass on the tour so far.

Ray Dutton dislocated a shoulder against Monaro, and Malcolm Reilly was fined £75 for a breach of discipline after an alleged off the field brawl. Reilly said he was provoked.

At the annual general meeting the Rugby Football league reported a surplus of £15,876 and the Northern Rugby League a surplus of £5,083. It was decided to give £600 to each club.

It was agreed that a substituted player could be used once as a substitute. A proposal that a drop-goal should only be valued at one point received equal votes for and against so it was left for the Council to decide before the next International Board meeting.
